1. Research your local repair café.
2. Create a poster advertising your local repair café. Include on your poster:
 - Name of repair shop
 - Opening times
 - Location
 - Optional: you may also want to include some fun facts about why its good to repair or the type of items that can be repaired
3. Encourage your local community to use your local repair café:
 - By teaching your parents, friends and neighbours about repairs
 - By distributing your posters in local shops, businesses, school to raise awareness
 - Are there any other communication methods you can use to let people know about the repair café and benefits?

Fun Facts

- There are 2,409 repair cafes around the world
- UK Repair Rates: Average 67%. Highest - Clothing and textiles 89%. Over 50% of product repairs are successfully completed using no spare parts
- Most commonly repaired items:
 - Bike
 - Radio
 - Clothes
 - Table lamp
 - Laptop
 - Vacuum cleaner
 - Jewellery
 - CD/DVD player
 - Toaster
 - Food mixer
 - Chair
 - Toy

Why it is good for the planet?

- It reduces the amount of raw materials and energy needed to make new products.
- It cuts CO2 emissions, for example, because manufacturing new products and recycling old ones causes CO2 to be released.
- Helps us think of our things more sustainable to repair them rather than replace them.
